

KEEPING THE NATIONAL GUARD HOME

Legislative Action: State legislatures across the country are taking action to bring and keep their state's National Guard home rather than in Iraq. The rationale is that the "Authorization for Use of Military Force Against Iraq" passed by Congress in 2002 should no longer be considered to be in effect.

The Authorization: Gave President Bush the ability to use military force against Iraq to "(1) defend the national security of the United States against the continuing threat posed by Iraq; and (2) enforce all relevant United Nations Security Council resolutions regarding Iraq."

Mission Accomplished: By any means of measurement, the purposes set forth in the Authorization were met with the ouster of the Saddam Hussein regime and the establishment of the current government of Iraq. No assertions are being made that the current government constitutes a threat to the United States.

What Wisconsin Could Do: The State Legislature could enact legislation stating that since the Authorization has expired that it will no longer permit the Wisconsin National Guard to be deployed to Iraq.

Governor Doyle could exercise his authority as Commander-in-Chief of the Wisconsin Guard and refuse to allow deployment of the Guard to Iraq.

Attorney General J.B. Van Hollen could file a lawsuit against the federal government to prevent deployment of the Guard to Iraq.
